



RULES OF ENGAGEMENT

Captains: Office Staff

Combatants/Spies: Students

Lieutenants: Teachers

Platoon: group of students

War Zone: Penny Jar area

Battlefield: Office

- 1.) Enter battlefield QUIETLY— Soldiers do not cross enemy lines yelling or talking loudly. They do not want to awaken the enemy or anger the Captains (who do have work to do).
- 2.) Soldiers and Spies may enter the office in platoons no bigger than 3 soldiers. If you see other soldiers already in the office, you must retreat until it is your turn
- 3.) Soldiers and spies are NOT allowed to hang out in the battlefield watching the action. They must gather their intel and report back to their base of operations quickly.
- 4.) Soldiers MAY NOT enter the war zone unless they have money to fire **AND** a Captain has granted permission.
- 5.) Soldiers may fire (add) money to ANY jar only when a Captain is present in the battlefield (during Lunch & after School)
- 6.) Once a soldier fires his weapon (puts money in a jar), the bullet (money) cannot be retrieved, moved or removed
- 7.) Remember Bullets of Copper (pennies) and Paper (dollar bills) are good for your own Jar. Bullets of any other metal are bad for your own jar. AND—Sabotage is fair game!
- 8.) The treaty of NHCS states that all soldiers should conduct themselves according to Biblical standards. SO-- be sure to keep this war civilized 😊
